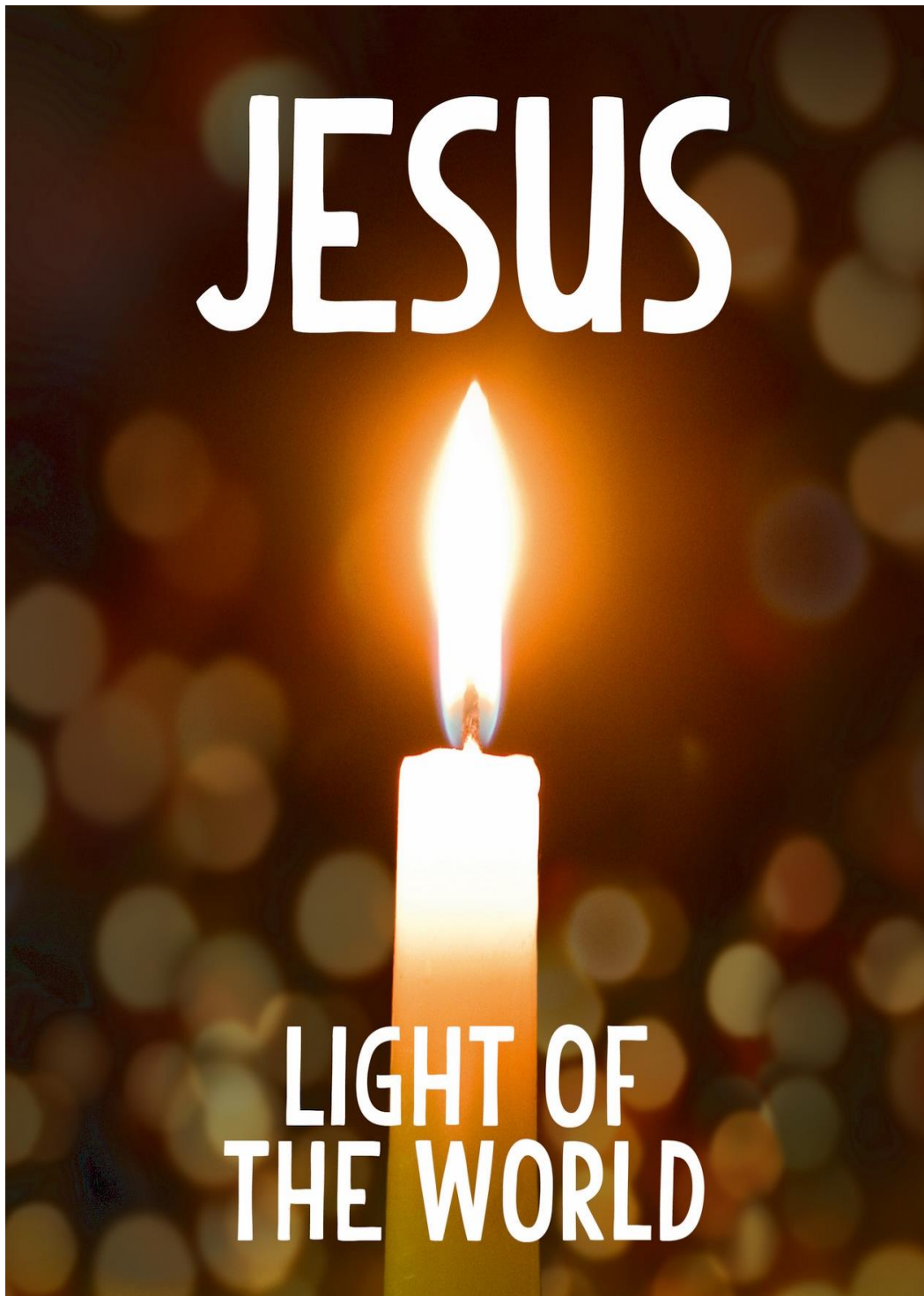

## **HERE MIGHT BE A REASON TO JOIN EBC’S SINGING GROUP !**

If you have reached the age where the memory is going .....

Next time you forget something, try taking some deep breaths. It seems that inhaling stimulates our brain, creating electrical activity where emotions, memory and smells are processed.

In a recent American study (at Northwestern University in Chicago) individuals were able to identify a face two seconds more quickly if they were breathing in through the nose, rather than breathing out. This may also explain why we breath rapidly when afraid. “If you are in a panic state, you spend proportionally more time inhaling ... Faster breathing could have a positive impact on brain function and result in faster response times.”
