



NEWS FROM BAPHUMELELE


Baphumelele Children's Home

Eynsham Baptist Church has been a supporter of Baphumelele Children's Home, Khaleyitsha, South Africa since 2003 when one of our young people, Matt Jerred, spent a year with the SCORE organisation living with an African family in the remote district of Karoolande. He visited Baphumelele on one of his feedback visits to Cape Town and, on his return, asked for support in helping this project. The Home is for orphaned children from babies to young adults, who have been affected by the AIDS virus. It was started by a Primary School teacher, Rosalia (Rosie) Mashale who had seen orphaned children scavenging regularly on rubbish tips.

We have watched the project grow from its beginnings where babies shared cots and there were no fridges to store medication, to a Community with its own gardens and café where the young people can work and classroom areas where children can have an education.

Our regular contributions are of great value in the continuation of this project.
