

Thanks to everyone who supported the various charities at the One World Week sale in October, and in particular thanks for over £500.00 which was raised for Baphumelele Children's Home in South Africa who EBC have supported for many years. Founded in 2001 by Rosie Mashale, a trained primary school teacher, it began as a refuge and place of safety for orphaned and other vulnerable children in the of Khayelitsha, one of the largest in South Africa. township Baphumelele (pronounced: ba-poo-meh-leh-leh), is a Xhosa word meaning 'you have progressed' and through the hard work, determination, and help of the community and friends overseas, Baphumelele has developed into a thriving community project whose vision is to provide a shelter for vulnerable/orphaned children and young adults with chronic diseases and HIV/Aids, and to provide skills development for the unemployed, early childhood care, alleviation of poverty, and healthcare information to the community.

TWAM - TOOLS WITH A MISSION

A Christian charity sending tools across the world

David Miller is putting together another collection of tools. There is an extensive list of what they can take so if you have something which you think could be used please speak to him as soon as possible. He needs to have items by the beginning of December please.

TWAM collect unwanted tools, refurbish them, sort them into trade kits and send them across the world (including Britain) for livelihood creation. They send around 20 containers filled with over 300 tonnes of tools every year. This supports local people in supporting their own communities through livelihood creating projects, provides dignity through work and the ability to provide for them and their families.
