Waiting for God's salvation

(2 Peter 3:8-15a)

But you must not forget this one thing, dear friends: A day is like a thousand years to the Lord, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord isn't really being slow about his promise, as some people think. No, he is being patient for your sake. He does not want anyone to be destroyed but wants everyone to repent. (vs. 8-9, NLT)

In this letter, the author encourages the community of faith and us into living faithfully. Like many of the Advent texts, this one too, invites us to explore: What does it mean to wait, to live in hope, and to have in faith?

This waiting is clearly neither a simple preparation for Christmas nor it is an outdated waiting of an event which has already taken place (Jesus' birth). These verses allow us to sit in God's space and time. It shows that although we wait for God's judgment, we do not wait in anxious fear but with great desire.

Verse 8 sets the stage by reshaping time and therefore redefining the idea of waiting: "with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day." God's time is not our time. Yet, at the end God's time does not remain separate or disconnected from our time. The delay of God's coming shouldn't be an occasion for mocking the community and its hopeful waiting. No, God's delay is the occasion of hope, of living in the knowledge and expectation of God's generosity, it is the proof of God's mercy towards all. God's delay is gift.

The next verse further expands the connection between waiting and mercy. The writer halts the community in creating boundaries between themselves and the outsiders. It either blurs or breaks open any artificially constructed stereotypes between us and them. It doesn't separate so to

separate the sheep from the goats but talks about the repentance of everyone. Which can be interpreted in two ways. On the one hand those who are already in the promise, who have heard the Gospel, are continually invited into repentance, renewal, and holiness. Which means that there is not an inside and an outside to this community, there is no simple distinction between the pure and the impure, and there is not a clear divide between "us" and "them." Even within the community there is a continued need for repentance. On the other hand, "everyone" could also refer to those who have not yet heard the Gospel or haven't responded positively. In which case, we are called into waiting others who are equally important to God to join us. They are not outsiders; they are just not yet in recognition of God's love. Thus, our waiting embodies God's desire for everyone to be saved (John 3:16).

During this Advent, this aspect of the theology of waiting is illustrated extremely well by the Covid-19 crisis. Even if vaccines are slowly getting available, we have to be patient and keep the restrictions up until everyone has the opportunity to be inoculated. In other words, just like with the second coming we have to wait until everyone is safe (saved). Amen

Prayer: *Peace-loving and peace-giving God, you bless us with your unfailing and unconditional love, we want to thank you for your love and tender mercy towards us. Generous God, you pour blessings and grace upon us, forgiving our failings, we wish to ask you to enrich our lives and quiet our hearts to be able to bring your love, mercy, and peace into the hearts of all people.*

EBC WEEKEND - SATURDAY 19th / SUNDAY 20th DECEMBER
