The theme this year is “making a stand”, with communities in Kenya and across the world, against the climate chaos, that has so affected their lives. To quote Christian Aid.... *“Kitui County in Eastern Kenya was already in the grip of a climate emergency. Severe drought followed by extreme and unpredictable changes in weather has destroyed crops, killed livestock, and continues to threaten livelihoods. Then the pandemic hit. We know ourselves that water and washing hands have been vital in helping to save lives during the pandemic. But what if there isn’t any? What if the nearest source is miles away on foot? This pandemic and climate crisis impact us all but more so people living in poverty in countries like Kenya.”*

We are being asked to give money to help people access life-saving water in Kenya. Together we can work with communities to make sure everyone has easy access to reliable water sources now and in the future by building an earth dam. Huge basins are dug in the ground to collect and store rain water. It’s then piped into taps for people to draw from simple, sustainable, and ingenious!

PRAYER

Prayer isn’t about trying to persuade a reluctant God to do something, or to craft a perfect set of words to win God over It starts in the most ordinary, instinctive reactions to everyday life:

Gratitude: good things are always happening to us, however small.

Wonder: we often see amazing things (e.g. in nature) but pass them by.

Need: we bump into scores of needs every day.

Sorrow: we’ve messed up.

Prayer is taking those instincts of gratitude, wonder, need, sorrow and the desire to help, and bringing them before God

Because Covid vaccines are free via the NHS, Revd Scott Patterson and his wife Rowan decided to ask people who could have afforded to pay for it if asked, to donate to UNICEF, the United Nations' children's charity. UNICEF has its own vaccination programme and wants to vaccinate **two billion people** by the end of 2021.

It’s fantastic that already half the adults in the UK have received their first Covid vaccination (each will cost between £4 and £30 depending on the type you receive). Love vs. fear (1 John 4:7-21)

And as we live in God, our love grows more perfect. So, we will not be afraid on the day of judgment, but we can face him with confidence... Such love has no fear because perfect love expels all fear... We love each other because he loved us first. (vs. 17-19, NLT)

It all begins with God's love. In case we ever forget this basic, essential fact of our faith, 1 John makes it crystal clear. God is the source and the meaning of love. God *is* love. God loves as the sun shines and love captures who God is.

Our text highlights that God's love is not some abstract concept, it is passion expressed in action. God made his love real by sending Jesus to live among us and to die for us. God continues to show us love through Jesus' life-giving presence among us. If ever we should question whether God truly does love us, the gift and witness of the Holy Spirit should be a confirmation.

God's love does not depend on our initiative or on our worthiness. We do not have to reach out to God or even believe in God in order to be loved. We do not have to clean up our act before God can love us. We do not have to measure up to some standard to be lovable. No, God showers love on us whether we deserve it or not. And honestly, who could ever deserve such amazing, immeasurable love?

The writer insists that the more fully and completely we know God, the more the immense reality of God's love dawns on us. When we open ourselves to the warmth and light of God's presence, we find that even our deepest, darkest secrets and the ugliest parts of ourselves are not beyond God's reach. Nothing in us is so broken or so filthy

that God is unwilling or unable to touch. God embraces us as we are, loves us as we are, and works in us to make us clean and whole and new.

However, the opposite of love for John is not hate, but fear. The idea encapsulated in verse 18 that "*Perfect love expels all fear*", is about the relationship between believers and God who is creator and judge of the world. If God would be understood exclusively as the God of power, or even God of justice, then we would only approach God with fear. But if we know Him first and foremost as the God of love, then we approach God with confidence.

The way the writer describes our connection with this divine love is key. It is **not** that "we *ought* to love because he first loved us" as if God's love were the ground for a *new requirement*. Instead, it is that "we *can* love because he first loved us," because God's love is the ground for a *new opportunity*. Even our imperfect human love has the power to dispel fear. Watch the growth of a child and notice that the child who can give love is the child who has received love. Love grows from love while from indifference only grows coldness, fear, and withdrawal.

Prayer: *God of all dominion and power, God of love; we can love only because you first loved us. Empower us by your Holy Spirit to be and do the same. When we rest in your love, fear - though present - cannot overpower us. Help us to rest there always.*
