

#### **OUR PRACTICAL GIFTS**

**The Gatehouse** is a drop-in café for the homeless in Oxford with an open door for anyone who is 25 or over, and aims to 'provide a place where dignity, companionship and refreshment can be found in a warm and safe environment'.

They give each of their homeless guests a small Christmas present each year so will be very grateful for any of the following: Gloves, Scarves, Socks, Hats, Pants, bars of chocolate (as a rough guide 90% of their guests are men.)

They have a *Christmas Present Wrapping Event* on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> December 2019 12 - 3pm at The Gatehouse, 10 Woodstock Road, Oxford OX2 6HT. All are welcome to help, including children providing they are accompanied by an adult.

In order to be able to offer their guests the café service they provide <u>every day</u> the following items will also be most gratefully received: coffee, jams, Marmite, Branston pickle, Bovril, Sugar, corned beef, Ovaltine, honey, tomato ketchup, squeezy mayo and salad cream, orange and blackcurrant squash, peanut butter, chocolate spread. Every 6 weeks throughout the year people in Eynsham provide home-made sandwiches, cakes and fruit for Gatehouse (the next date is Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> December). This is co-ordinated by Raymond and Revel Elliot (St Peter's Church, Eynsham) and they can be contacted on 881346 if you'd like to know more.

#### **OUR FINANCIAL GIFTS**

Monetary offerings will be shared between Asylum Welcome, North Oxfordshire Food Bank and Bronze Healthcare Clinic in Uganda. Asylum Welcome helps asylum seekers, refugees and detainees who have fled persecution and danger in their own countries and seek refuge in Oxford and Oxfordshire: Marcus Thompson will be happy to give you more information. The Food Bank is a voluntary group formed by members of local Christian churches whose aim is to provide food parcels to people within the Kidlington, Woodstock, Chipping Norton and Charlbury area (and including Eynsham). The parcels contain essential food for individuals and families in case of emergency, covering the time it takes for other social care infrastructure to come into play: speak to Derek Malin for more information. The Bronze Healthcare Clinic, Busia, Eastern Uganda was set up by 2 trained nurses to enable women in this very poor area to have access to all aspects of pregnancy advice and a safe place to give birth. It is at present a very basic facility with a consultation room, birthing room and a fridge for vaccines. The aim is to move out to a purpose-built Clinic. The shell is already built, but money needs to be found to complete it - about £6000. So far £1400 has been raised, via a village concert and sale, and any donations which will be put to good use. Speak to Larry and June Poole to find out more about this project.

We are sorry to bring news of the death of Graham Elliott on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November. Graham was a member of St Leonard's Church, but always actively involved in our three churches outreach, particularly August OASIS, and he will be much missed. The funeral is at 2.00 p.m. on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> November at South Oxfordshire Crematorium followed by a celebration of life service at St Leonard's Church, Eynsham at 3.00 p.m. Graham requested people should wear bright colours. We send our sympathy, love and prayers to Barbara and the family at this sad time.
