

Doing what is right! (Romans 7:13-25)

So, you see how it is: my new life tells me to do right, but the old nature that is still inside me loves to sin. Oh, what a terrible predicament I am in! Who will free me from my slavery to this deadly lower nature? Thank God! It has been done by Jesus Christ our Lord. He has set me free. (vs. 24-25 TLB)

In Romans 7 apostle Paul continues to unfold the idea of the corrupt human nature. Paul thinks that when it comes to right and wrong humans have a *moral compass* or *common sense*. In a given situation we know what is right and what is wrong. Even if we do the wrong thing, deep down we know what would have been the right thing to do.

The role of the law was more than just to codify cultural costumes and behaviours, it actually "set-it-in-stone" this common-sense morality and established the boundary between right and wrong. The law was *necessary* because it created a shared moral platform. However, the law was only intended to be neutral because its only purpose was to inform humanity about right and wrong. Therefore, the law was and still is *ineffective* because it cannot convince anyone to do the right thing. Moreover, the law *can generate desires* which might not have been generated otherwise. For example in Little Rock, Arkansas, is reported that people honk their horns more often since the city passed the policy that "no person shall sound the horn on a vehicle at any place where cold drinks or sandwiches are served after 9:00 p.m."

Our corrupt human nature often tries to circumvent or even break the law because it is there, even if deep down we feel is not the right thing to do. We are doing it almost for the sake of it. Like the people who attended mass gatherings during lockdown and later complained about lack of social distancing.

Finally, when I read about the apostle's predicament of trying to do good and failing, I was reminded of the documentary about the spread of Covid-19 on cruise liners entitled *Billion Pound Cruises: All at Sea.* What struck me was that cruise ships around the world continued to board new passengers three weeks after the *Diamond Princess* incident showed how deadly can the virus be on cruise ships. A couple travelling on MS Zaandam boarded the ship on the eve of lockdown. When the reporter asked them if they were worried about the pandemic at the time they said that they were a little concerned about the virus, but because the government did not declare a ban on cruising, they were more concerned about losing their reservation fees. However, once they were stranded in the Pacific Ocean, chased off by a gunboat and unable to pass through the Panama Canal, they realised that boarding the ship was not their best decision. Thank God we are enabled through Christ to make the right decision and do what is right.

Prayer: Life-giving God, we offer You thanksgiving and praise for all that You have done for us. Through the life, death, and resurrection of Your Son, Jesus Christ, we have been set free: free from the power of sin that leads to death, free to follow the leading of Your Holy Spirit, free to love You with all our heart and soul and strength, free to approach you in prayer! To You alone, life-giving God, belongs all praise and honour and glory and blessing. Amen.

R S Thomas (1913 - 2000)

Ronald Stuart Thomas was born in Cardiff in 1913, the son of a sea captain. Educated at University College of North Wales, he undertook theological training at St Michael's College, Cardiff and was ordained as an Anglican priest in 1936. He began to write poetry and verse and his writing career continued for fifty years during which time he was nominated for a Nobel prize and awarded the Queen's Gold Medal for Poetry. He loved the countryside and spent his life as a clergyman working in rural parishes.
