When all the saints...

(Revelation 7:9-17)

There were so many people that no one could count them. They were from every nation, tribe, people, and language of the earth. They were all standing before the throne & before the Lamb. They wore white robes and had palm branches in their hands. (v. 9, ICB)

I recently heard a story about a Bible college professor (could be Baptist) who tried to explain the meaning of All Saints Day to a first-year class. One of the students abruptly stood up and replied, "but we don't have saints!" The quick-witted professor grabbed computer and quickly googled "protestant churches near me," and asked the student to read the names of all the churches in the area. The student read, "St. James Baptist Church, St. John's Lutheran Church, John Knox Presbyterian Church," until he gave up and said, "I get it now!"

This story perfectly illustrates that we all have saints -- those who are deceased, and those who are living and walking among us, or if we follow apostle Paul's thinking perhaps even we ourselves are saints. The word *saint* is not limited to the "greats" of history, for writers in the New Testament use the term synonymously with *Christian* and *believer*.

Revelation 7 is a vision (or dream) of a time when *All Saints* will be gathered together in the presence of God. In our reading the writer describes a great multitude that is countless from every tribe and people, and language. There is no limit to the scope of this multitude, be it geographic, ethnic, numeric,

linguistic, economic ... the list goes on and on.

In this vision the multitude is waving palm branches, and it is crying hymns of praise in a loud voice. Which parallels the Triumphal Entry scene at Palm Sunday. But there is a major difference between the group in Jerusalem and this heavenly multitude. Unlike the crowd in the Jerusalem that later turns its back on Jesus, this multitude will remain faithful to the Lamb "forever and ever."

Apart from being loyal to the lamb, they are also involved, they themselves actively washed their robes. They do not wait to be served by God, but they actively seek to serve God, they are keen in living out their worship all the time. The result of which is they are shielded, they are nourished, they are quenched, and they are protected (v. 15-17).

On All Saints Day many Christians around the world celebrate the lives of those saints who have gone on before them and give thanks for those saints living still today. Maybe this time around we should also reflect on how we are called to live lives of sanctity. This passage reminds us that being a faithful witness is the *baptismal* (robes washed) vocation of us all. It also reminds us that when we live out our Christian vocation. we find safety in the Lamb of God who sustains all of us. Most importantly, this passage reminds us that the vision for sainthood is all encompassing. Which is a reminder that sanctity is partially a Christian vocation, but it is also the work of God. Sanctity does not originate from us. it comes from the Lamb who we are made free to approach at any time.

Prayer: Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God forever and ever! God you gave us the strength to be the saints, therefore we can live the way of God with confidence for God is our shepherd and will quide us to the spring of life. Amen.
