## Waiting for God's grace

(1 Corinthians 1:3-9)

I am always giving thanks to my God for you because of the grace of God that was given to you in Christ Jesus, that in every way you were enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge. (vs. 3&4, Mounce)

Our reading is the opening thanksgiving of the apostle Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. It is commonly noted that the thanksgiving sections of his letters are like an abbreviated table of contents of his letters. Indeed, there are hints of some members dominating over others, suggestions of squabbles over spiritual gifts, and indications of factions which weakened the fellowship. But since these subtle references are part of a thanksgiving prayer, they reframe these issues around the bigger picture, namely: what God has done and will continue to do for them.

Paul first gives thanks for the grace of God which was given in Christ Jesus. The fact that Paul focuses his readers' attention first on God's grace in Christ suggests that the Corinthian believers might have lost this focus and think of themselves as self-made people, who can achieve on their own whatever they want. Yet, Paul's thankfulness springs from this deeply rooted gratitude for God, and whatever else he wants the Corinthians to be grateful for stem from this primary reason for gratitude - God's grace in Jesus Christ.

Paul also gives thanks for the enriched speech and knowledge the Corinthians possess. Yet, this is not their doing, it is the work of the Spirit in them. Paul later talks about speaking in tongues, prophecy, speaking knowledge and wisdom, and having revelation, but it is God who is the source of these spiritual gifts. Paul is worried not only that the Corinthian believers have focused on

themselves rather than on God when they experience manifestations of the Spirit, but he is also worried that they are deluded into thinking that what is now is all there is.

The Corinthian believers had spiritual exceptional experiences. These experiences were so powerful that some of the Corinthian believers thought they now had been given the completion of what God offers in Christ. They felt they had no need to hope or wait for more. But to think that this life even if it is marvellously imbued with a sense of God's Spirit – is all God offers is dead wrong, because it misses the key to God's grace in Christ Jesus. God in Christ gives life. A life which is much more than the best we could imagine.

Advent is a time of hopeful waiting and this year with the covid-19 crisis this goes beyond the spiritual aspect of waiting for Christ. It also involves a physical and a psychological aspect. On the one hand, we wait in hope for a vaccine which can eliminate the effects of the dreaded virus and save lives, on the other hand we wait for the lifting of the lockdown which can restore our soul starving for physical contact with our friends and family. Our reading reminds us, what we must not forget during this year's Advent is that the essence of our hopeful waiting is not human effort, but divine grace. Amen

Prayer: This Advent, we hope and pray for: joy as we journey together, sight for the blind and healing for the sick, freedom for the prisoners and good news for the poor, release for the oppressed with justice for all and love for each other. And the coming of God's topsy-turvy, inside out, upside-down Kingdom. (http://third-space.org.uk/)

How quickly I gain a false sense of security in my "comfort zones." I like to think of myself as a person comfortable with change. But the truth is that I struggle with change just as much as anyone. And it does not take much for me to feel off-balance. The truth is that I am afraid of change. Even good change can be seen a threat to my safety. Because the unknown is fraught with danger, even when I am being led to something bigger, better, or brighter. With change, there is an inevitable period of mourning. I mourn

the loss of the routines I did not know I had grown so fond of. I mourn the loss of the sense of security that comes with predictability. I mourn the friendships that will inevitably wither, no matter how hard I try to keep them going. But as I take step after step into the unknown, I believe that you are the very ground on which I stand. As long as I can remember this, I have nothing to fear. So, I will step into the unknown fearlessly and joyfully, knowing that you will keep me grounded and will not let me fall.

Amen."

encouragement to those who are struggling. No-one needs judging at the moment. We all need understanding and grace.

All of which brings us to our Heavenly Father. Our God is the one who designed and made us. He knows our minds will struggle to cope with all this. That is why we need not worry about coming to Him as we are - fear, worry, stress and all. It's ok to come to God as we are, especially when 'as we are' is not ok. In the end His promise still stands 'Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathise with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are yet he did not sin. Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. -Hebrews 4:14-16' "
