Cows in Sackcloth, a strange reaction to a sermon (Jonah 3:1-5, 10)

When God saw what they had done and how they had put a stop to their evil ways, he changed his mind and did not carry out the destruction he had threatened. (v.10, NLT)

By starting the Book of Jonah at chapter 3, we enter the story right in the middle of the action. "The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time." We all know what happened the first time. Jonah's no Peter, Andrew, James, or John. He does not leave what he's doing and immediately follow God's call. He jumps on the first boat going in the opposite direction. It is as if Peter, Andrew, James, and John, upon encountering Jesus, jumped into their fishing boats and rowed like madmen for the opposite shore.

So, Jonah runs away, but God sends a storm, at which point Jonah asks the sailors to throw him overboard. But God decided to save Jonah and give him a second chance employing a big fish. This is where we enter the story. "Get up and go to Nineveh, that great city."

This time, Jonah obeys. He walks into the city, and preaches the shortest sermon ever recorded: "Forty days more, and Nineveh will be overthrown!"

The response is electric. Immediately, the people of Nineveh believe God, and here is where the humour builds. The king, orders human and animal alike to fast and put on sackcloth. Imagine sackcloth-covered cows, sheep and people asking for forgiveness. And behold God changes his mind about the punishment.

Jonah should be ecstatic. He has brought about a mass conversion that Billy Graham could only aspire to. Every inhabitant of the city, human and animal alike, has come forward for the altar call. But Jonah is not ecstatic. Jonah is mad. "Ah, LORD, is this not what I said would happen ... because I know that you are a God gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and ready to relent from punishing."

Jonah is more than just a story about a big fish. It is a hilarious story with a point. The point being our call in the light of the sovereignty of God. The thing is that following the call of God does not make God obey us: God is God and often does not act as we imagined he would. In good faith, we may follow where we hear God's call and we are prepared to bring God's word to that place. But what we find is that God is already there before us. We find that no people, and no place, not even Nineveh, can properly be called God-forsaken.

Jonah also challenges us at a more personal level. If you think of a person that you find difficult to love you have to remember that God loves that person as well as loving you. The same God who gave Jonah a second chance gives the people of Nineveh a second chance, and we cannot begrudge that kind of mercy. This is a God gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, a God who revealed himself fully in Jesus Christ.

Prayer: Holy God, we would rather proclaim death to our enemies, than see them forgiven and redeemed. Forgive our hardness of heart, O God, and our reluctance to see your divine image in those who hate and despise us. Teach us to love our enemies, that our lives may proclaim your truth – that love is stronger than hate, and mercy is greater than vengeance. We ask this in the name of the Prince of Peace. Amen.
