## Is The Ten Commandments still relevant? (Exodus 20:1-17)

Then God gave the people all these instructions: "I am the Lord your God, who rescued you from the land of Egypt, the place of your slavery... I lavish unfailing love for a thousand generations on those who love me and obey my commands. (vs. 1&6, NLT)

God creates, names, and calls us and then he continues to recreate us. We aim to express our new creation, yet we regularly fail to live up to his name. Some misplaced desire, some grief, some reckless act takes over and we find ourselves lost and afraid. Throughout the history Christian writers compared this *losing-sight-of-God* with "wandering in the wilderness".

Often, we wander through life blissfully unaware that we lost ourselves, our destination, and God. We forget that life is bigger than us and at the end all we are left with is our grief over what we have lost, to which we cling with all our might. While all this time God seeks again (and again) to call us, to embrace us within a community of fellow travellers, to provide us with a place and a way of living, and to say to us "This is what you were made for."

By the time Israel gets the Ten Commandments at Mount Sinai they have already experienced how God has liberated them from slavery and set them on a journey through the wilderness. They encountered thirst and hunger, and God has provided sweet water and bread from heaven. They have been attacked and have been victorious, and they have finally reached Sinai. This is where God makes a pact with Israel: Israel will become God's beloved people, a

priestly kingdom and a holy nation, as long as they keep their end of the agreement.

Interestingly, from the very beginning of the Ten Commandments God makes it clear that they were always part of the story of God's intention for humanity. God begins by identifying Himself as the one "who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery," (v.2). This statement not only identifies God through his actions but also remind the people of who *they* are: the ones whom God delivered (v.6).

But if take a closer look, we can notice that The Decalogue reaches farther back. The commandment to "Honour your father and mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you," recalls the covenant with Abraham and Sarah to whom that land was first promised. And in verse 4, the phrases used ("heaven above," "earth beneath," and "water under the earth") resembles the language of the first creation narrative. The God who separated those waters at the creation is the only God who is worthy of worship.

Looking at the Ten Commandments from this perspective it becomes clear that from the *beginning* God's destination was Sinai. The ultimate destination for the Israelites, of course, is Canaan, the land that God promised to Abraham. But before they can arrive there, they must get to Sinai.

The whole journey, from creation forward, has been leading to Sinai. It is at this place that God shows the Israelites the harmonious world in which they are meant to live and calls them to

live in it. It is as if God is saying: this is what you were made for. You were not made to wander, to be afraid, to hunger and thirst, to be lost. You were made to live in this community of justice, in right relationship with your God.

Of course, we fail, but Sinai serves as a signpost, ever reminding us of the sacred community for which we were made. Amen.

Prayer: All heaven and earth proclaim the majesty of God's creative power! Praise God for the amazing and awesome beauty. He has given us instructions to live in harmony and peace. In his commandments, God showed us way to respect one another. So, rejoice in God's goodness and praise his steadfast love for us. Amen.
