Olympic Gold

Next month sees the start of the Tokyo Olympics, having been postponed from last year due to the Coronavirus pandemic. A number of New Testament letters refer to Olympic sport including Hebrews: 'Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith' (Hebrews 12:1-2).

The Christian life is compared to a long-distance race, but despite the struggles and obstacles, there is a great crowd of witnesses cheering us on. We have a heavenly Father who loves us and a Saviour who has run the race before us. If we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, He will enable us to finish the race.

During the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, the British athlete Derek Redmond was running in the semi-finals of the 400 metres. About 250 metres from the finish his hamstring tore. He fell to the ground in pain and stretcher bearers came over to him. However, Redmond was determined to finish the race and so he started hopping toward the finishing line. Suddenly Jim Redmond, Derek's father, ran out of the stands towards him. "You don't have to do this," he told his son. "Yes, I do," said Derek, to which his father said, "We're going to finish this together." They completed the lap with Derek leaning on his father's shoulder. As they crossed the finish line, the spectators rose to give Derek a standing ovation. Although he didn't win an Olympic medal, Derek Redmond finished the race with his father at his side. Let's not forget the encouragement we have to finish the race!

UPDATE FROM UGANDA

We received the following email from one of our primary contacts in Uganda.

"In Uganda we are experiencing the second wave of Covid 19 which seems to be more deadly as compared to the first one. More and more cases have been reported. And reports are worrying as many people are dying of not being able to afford ICU and oxygen! We have been hearing these from a distance but it is now happening in our own villages.

Like many other countries in a bid to control the spread of the pandemic, Uganda has banned public gatherings like places of worship and all public and private transport, closed schools and restricted movement between districts. While it is helping to control the spread of the pandemic, but is having a hard negative impact on impoverished families. The president pronounced the lockdown from 7th June up to 30th July 2021. And we don't know what will happen thereafter.

Looking at the impacts so far. "This Covid-19 period has handicapped us," says one of the caregivers of Bright Hope Orphanage. "Men who are breadwinners like myself are no longer able to provide even basic needs like food to our families. This has sparked big family misunderstandings and domestic violence", he continued.

Providing family necessities at this time is harder than ever. The normal situation here is hand to mouth on a daily basis. You don't work, you don't eat and providing for your family is difficult. There is a saying here "Zokola Zolya" (ZZ) meaning what you make is what you eat on a daily basis and no saving.

Food supply has decreased as farmers struggle to transport their produce to markets, and many markets have closed due to social distancing procedures.

Due to the lockdown, we are worried about a rise in teenage pregnancy and child marriage. Ever since schools were closed, so many girls and boys are idle and in one place. One youth said. "We feel so confined to one environment. We can no longer participate in social networks like sports galas, community dialogues and religious activities". They are keeping themselves busy by getting involved in behaviour which could lead to unwanted pregnancies and child marriage. I heard a rumour that in some villages parents are giving their airls to men for marriage so that they can get money for food.

In response to these, we want to translate the situation to ministry opportunities. We engage ourselves in biblical counselling, sharing the gospel, caring and meeting basic needs like food. We call upon your involvement and praying with and for us here. May the Lord Jesus Christ glorify himself in this situation?

They themselves are going to need more support in the coming weeks as the lockdown bites once more. Our belief is that, having put so much effort into raising funds to build this marvellous clinic, we should not allow it to wither on the vine of the pandemic. We are talking with Sam about starting a fund to meet the cost of treatment for those who cannot afford to pay much. We have not got to the 'nuts and bolts' of how to organise it yet, but is an effective way of both keeping the clinic in business and reaching out to the increased numbers of people who can't afford treatment at this time. The tap flow can be turned up or down as the situation changes.

There are also choughs on Holyhead Mountain, and puffins in the Spring, so there's usually plenty to see. The steps to the lighthouse zig-zag down the side of the Mountain.
