Lessons from flying a kite

(A Messy Church message)

Flying a kite is one of the most exciting things I did as a child. And even if nowadays new technology has replaced this outdated pastime with remote controlled planes and drones, flying one is still a unique experience, because it makes us aware of the forces of nature which are beyond our control.

Last Sunday on the Messy Church picnic we made our own kites (**see photo**) and tried to fly it, with little success due to lack of sustained wind. However, building the kite allowed us to talk about the kite as an example of Christian life:

- 1. At the core of the kite there is a cross shaped structure without which controlling it would be impossible. This reminded us that at the heart of our Christian life there must also be a cross, the Cross of Jesus. This is what shapes our value system and gives us moral support.
- 2. The sail that covers the kite is light and flimsy (we used binbags), yet it can harness the thrust of the wind and make the kite soar. Similarly, our life even if it is weak and vulnerable as a kite sail can soar because it is kept afloat by the power of God.
- 3. Finally, the paper strips attached to the tail of the kite gives it stability in the air and keeps it in the direction of the wind. Similarly, in our Christian life we often find ourselves in need of guidance, which we often find in the various books of the Bible.

"He gives power to the weak and strength to the powerless. Even youths will become weak and tired, and young men will fall in exhaustion. But those who trust in the Lord will find new strength. They will soar high on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not faint." (Isaiah 40:29-31)
