

ASYLUM WELCOME

Asylum Welcome directly helped 2,300 people over the last year, and there is a heart-rending story behind almost each one of them.

We can be proud that EBC is one of many local churches, community groups and individuals who support this 'welcoming' of refugees, often families, from Syria, Afghanistan, Ukraine and many other countries, who arrive in Oxford and Oxfordshire.

The welcoming 'drop in' centre in Magdalen Road offers crucial advice on the UK asylum process - which for everyone leads to the key decision affecting their future here. That Home Office decision apart, Asylum Welcome offers help in a range of other practical ways: English lessons, groceries from the foodbank, money from the hardship fund, a bicycle to get around, the youth club, help at school and college, laptops for education, help in resettlement, in finding employment... and so on. No surprise that many of the current volunteers came to Britain as refugees. There is also important work to strengthen refugee groups themselves so they can better help their own communities.

Asylum Welcome's Annual Review of the last year makes interesting reading. It summarises the different services, the numbers, and what is spent on each of the services. I've put a few copies on our Sunday morning 'coffee table', so we can better inform ourselves how well our support is used.
