CAKES - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

There has been guite a bit of confusion and mis-information around the provision of homemade cakes etc so advice has been sought direct from the FSA (Food Standards Agency). The situation is that as this is a charity event, it is not a legal requirement to label anything. It is however, a sensible and commonly followed practice so we would be grateful if anyone making food could please ensure it is wrapped in see-through wrapping and clearly labelled e.g. chocolate cake, with the ingredients listed, so that those with allergies can then make informed purchases. You are not required to put your name and address on what you make.

Very Good News

Many thanks to all who have supported Riverside Gardens Community with their efforts to mitigate flooding. Last year I wrote that we'd had a donation of £20, 000, which was wonderful.

We heard in September that SSEN Resilient Fund has given us another £40,000 towards completing this project. This will enable all the at-risk flats to mitigate flooding with passive front Flood Doors and Flood Patio Doors.

The passive doors mean that all the locking mechanisms are in the larger handles, so people from this elderly, vulnerable community won't need to get on the floor to secure lower bolts, as happened in the past.

Thank you for all your prayers and the support by attending our cake sales etc. We raised £500. A special mention to Larry, who, even in difficult times, provided a great atmosphere at the sale this year, along with the other Woodentops!
