Between Easter and Pentecost

Luke 24: 36-53

Two Christians are talking about church life. "How can you tell it's the Sunday after Easter?" – one asks. "The minister takes a Sunday off." – answers the other.

Easter is usually the second busiest time in the life of Christian churches, and the week after Easter often is the time for all of us – but especially ministers, choirs and worship groups – to recover from the agony of Holy Week and the ecstasy of Easter, to put up our feet and have a cuppa.

Easter kind of wears us out which is understandable, but it is also unfortunate, because Easter is the beginning, not the conclusion. Just as our faith does not end with Good Friday crucifixion, neither does it end with Easter resurrection. We may be exhausted, but the New Testament story continues. Resurrection is clearly a pivotal moment in this drama; but there is another act to follow. Pentecost. If we would stop the story here it would be only about getting people to heaven when they die. But the story of God's Kingdom is much, much more. It is about a lifelong following of Christ.

Clarence Jordan, founder of the Habitat for Humanity writes that, "The Good News of the resurrection is not that we shall die and go home with him but that he is risen and comes home with us, bringing all his hungry, naked, thirsty, sick, prisoner brothers and sisters with him."

However, right now we are in between times. Resurrection has occurred, but the coming of the Spirit's power is ahead of us still. Right now, we are still waiting and listening and reading the signs of the times. During this in betweenness the "Jesus gang" was redefined and reshaped not a global movement.

Living under the shadow of the corona virus makes me understand what the early disciples might have felt: *waiting to spring into action but staying put until the power of the spirit is revealed*. So, this time of in-betweenness can be a time of reshaping for us as well. When we recognise the real values in life and how the resurrected Jesus is with us all the way.
